EVCCA 2021 Report Card Summaries

+ = Alliance Supported Bills - = Alliance Opposed Bills

+ HCR 2001 – initiatives; single subject; title

Requires a single subject for Arizona initiatives.

+ HB 2018 – schools; audits; financial records; budgets

Modernizes the system for public school financial records.

+ HB 2026 – nuclear emergency management; appropriations; assessments

A biennial bill that appropriates money from the Nuclear Emergency Management Fund.

+ HB 2055 – career; technical education; projects fund

Modifies permissible uses for a technical education projects fund.

+ HB 2160 – occupational safety; advisory committee; enforcement

Allows the Occupational Safety and Health Director to excuse a contested late notification.

+ HB 2321 – qualified facilities

Extends and increases the Credit for Qualified Facilities.

+ SB 1066 – state agencies; technology plans; deadline

Changes the dates for information technology plans to be submitted.

+ SB 1377 – civil liability; public health pandemic

Requires a higher threshold for COVID-19 lawsuits to be brought against businesses.

+ SB 1497 – ballot measures; proposition 105; disclosure

Places a disclosure about Prop 105 atop the ballot measure section.

+ SB 1124 – angel investment tax credit; extension

Extends the Angel Investment Tax Credit (Qualified Small Businesses) until 2034.

+ SB 1297 – income tax filing extension; 2020

Extended the Arizona Income Tax filing deadline to match the federal government.

+ SB 1783 – small business; alternate income tax

Phases in a 2.5% small business tax rate for pass through business entities. Increases the personal property tax threshold to \$1 million.
